# The Yedrin review



Suncare SG has been registered as a charity under the Charities Act since 17 October 2022 and obtained IPC status on 27 November 2023.



## Launch of the Lighthouse





The Lighthouse by Suncare SG was officially launched on 11 November 2023, and stands as a beacon of hope and transformation.

It is the first of its kind in Singapore, a children and youth-centric pop-up, sustainable space, dedicated to supporting the personal growth and mental well-being of children and youths.



Our Programmes

**You Power** is a mentorship programme that connects volunteers to vulnerable children and youths for academic and personal growth, providing support to help them gain confidence.

Through the You Power programme, participants develop into confident individuals, gaining the courage to express themselves openly. One participant, who initially joined our other programmes as a mentee and was recognised as a peer supporter in school, eventually became a mentor here.





**You Shine** is an after-school programme promoting self-directed learning and social activities which strengthen peer bonding while encouraging socio-emotional regulation.

Classroom-based learning fosters social mixing among students, providing opportunities for interaction and collaboration that contribute to their social development.

## Our Programmes



You'll Be Alright is a fun and engaging experiential programme, where guided theatrical exercises and art work allow participants to explore and express their emotions, thoughts and experiences.

Through the programme, we witness the transformation of an initally shy and reserved participant gradually opening up, becoming more willing to try new things and express his ideas.

The use of drama, role-play and creative expression allows youths to become self-aware and better understand concepts of self-identity ("I am"), capability ("I can") and support systems ("I have").

Let's Play is a pioneering pilot programme by Centre for Holistic Initiatives for Learning and Development (CHILD) at the Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, NUS, Suncare SG and Temasek Foundation to promote caregiver sensitivity through play interactions with young children aged 0 - 3 years old.



Our Programmes

You Power + is a Sports Mentoring
Programme that provides opportunities for mentees to learn technical skills
and strategies. Mentors can serve as
role models, offering advice on leadership, teamwork, resilience, and
goal-setting, which are all essential
skills both in sports and in life. Sports
mentoring programmes often foster a
sense of community and belonging
among participants.





Mentor training - You Power+ offers a unique Mentor Training Program, empowering mentors with essential skillsets to support mentees facing various challenges - academic, socio-emotional, and more. Mentors focus on befriending and building trusting relationships while adeptly handling mentees with behavioural and emotional issues.

You Sparkle - Building on a previous engagement with children around music, we are curating a special programme called You Sparkle in collaboration with ComLink+ and Voices of Singapore to form a choir aimed at empowering children aged 7 to 14.



## Our Policy

#### **Funding Sources**

Suncare SG is a charity that supports the well-being of children and youths by building programmes and equipping communities to support the social and emotional wellbeing of children and youth in Singapore. Our clients benefit from an incubation model from science backed research. Suncare SG is supported by donations and government grants.

#### **Conflict of interest Policy**

Suncare SG has put in place a conflict of interest policy to assist in identifying and managing potential areas of conflict. All board members, key management personnel, staff members and volunteers have to declare any situation of conflict that may arise. But members and key management personnel do not vote and abstain from decision-making when conflicts of interest arise.

#### **HR Policy**

Staff at Suncare SG undergo a yearly performance review, during which they are appraised. During the session, performance appraisals are done between the Executive Director and the staff members, and clear goals are set for their performance. Volunteer tutors receive performance feedback through classroom observations throughout the academic year, while volunteer hotline counsellors receive feedback through supervision by the head of counselling services. Salary increments and staff remuneration are recommended for approval by board of Suncare SG on a yearly basis.

#### **Reserves Policy**

The reserves that we have set aside provide financial stability and the means for the development of our principal activity. Suncare SG raises funds to support our current and future services to reach out to more young people and their families in need, up to a maximum of 2 years of our projected future gross operating expenses. Such funds do not include funds specified for restricted use. The purpose of establishing results is to ensure stability for Suncare SG and continuity in services to our beneficiaries. The amount of reserves that is required will be reviewed on a yearly basis by the board.

#### Loans, Donations, Grants and Financial Assistance Policy

Suncare SG does not provide any loans, donations, grants or financial assistance to any parties.
